ABOUT THE JOB

The School of Kinesiology, College of Education and Human Development, UMTC, is seeking an outstanding candidate to fill a tenured Associate or Full Professor position in Kinesiology. The appointment is a full-time, 9-month, and contingent upon qualifications and University processes. Salary is competitive and commensurate with experience. The start date is August 26, 2019, which is the beginning of the 2019-20 academic year.

POSITION DESCRIPTION

The position expectations include:

- Maintaining an active and independent research program in one of the cutting-edge fields in Sport Sociology or Sport and Exercise Psychology focusing on women and girls in sport and physical activity
- Holding a leadership position in the Tucker Center for Research on Girls & Women in Sport. This interdisciplinary research center is devoted to sponsoring, promoting, and disseminating scholarly work on how sport and physical activity affect the lives of girls and women, their families, and communities.
- Seeking and securing external funding to support research and other scholarly work
- Disseminating research findings through publication and presentation in the scientific community
- Teaching undergraduate and graduate courses in Sport Sociology and/or Sport and Exercise Psychology
- Mentoring and advising master's and doctoral students for thesis and dissertation research
- Serving at the departmental, college and University levels, as well as in the greater professional field and community

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

- Earned a doctorate degree in Kinesiology, Sociology, Psychology, or a doctorate in a closely related field
- Successful record of research productivity related to girls and women in sport and physical activity, as demonstrated by publication in high-quality, peer-reviewed scientific journals
- Evidence of high quality teaching experience in Sport Sociology and/or Sport and Exercise Psychology or related fields at the college or university level
- Track record of receiving extramural funding supporting research and other scholarly work
- Demonstrated experience in advising and mentoring graduate and undergraduate students
- Evidence of active engagement in departmental, college, university, and greater professional field and community service

- The overall qualifications of the candidates must meet the standards for tenure at the University of Minnesota.

- Record of leadership in basic and applied research settings including supervision and coordination of multiple research projects
- Experience in conducting interdisciplinary and collaborative research with colleagues in other related fields of Kinesiology and scientific community
